

## IN PERSON & ONLINE WORKSHOPS

### Leaping Lizards

Grades 1–8

Fun for all ages and abilities, this project will focus on the basic elements of art; **shape, line and colour**. Learn how to start a drawing by using simple shapes and line. Explore the endless possibilities of colour combinations within the colour wheel. Let your imagination run wild, creating a crazy colourful creature.



Students will experiment with line, shape and learn the basic of colour theory.

**Curriculum connections:** Visual Arts, Science.

### Layered Landscape Illustrative Collage

Grades 3-12

Canada's vast and diverse landscape has long been a source of inspiration for artists and storytellers. Students will explore their connection to our natural environment through an illustrative collaged piece of art. Using decorative and textured papers and a little paint students will create a layered landscape conveying the depth, colours and elements of nature that surround us.




**Curriculum connections:** Visual Arts, Science.

### Graphite Rock Sculpture

Grades 3-12

With a simple sculpture of rocks as our inspiration students will expand their knowledge of the basic elements of art – shape, line, texture, form, space and value. Using graphite students will learn how to create form and texture through value and shading. Students will also gain an understanding of light and shadow as they analyze the different types of shadows in their sculpture.



**Curriculum connections:** Visual Arts, Science.

### Charcoal Birch Forest

Grades 3-12

Using charcoal powder students will create a birch tree forest with the depth and richness that only charcoal can provide. With this medium students will be able to create the deepest shadows and lightest highlights. Explore drawing and mark making techniques that will add interest and atmosphere to your work.

## IN PERSON WORKSHOPS

### Watercolour Birch

Grades 1–8

Canadian forests and colours inspire this work of art. Students will use watercolour pencil as well as traditional watercolour paint to create the textures and colours in this vibrant piece. Many fun techniques will also be used to create interesting effects.

**Curriculum connections:** Visual Arts, Science.



### Blue Footprint

Grades 4–8

Inspired by water, the substance that sustains all life and makes our planet so unique, students will reflect on our connection with water from a personal to a global scale. We'll explore our responsibilities surrounding the complex issue of growth vs conservation and examine our Blue Footprint.

Students will use multi-media techniques to create a personal and reflective piece of art.

**Curriculum connections:** Visual Arts, Science, Social Studies, Language.



### Weaving Water Tales

Grades 4–8

Canada's vast waterways and diverse landscape have long been a source of inspiration. Together we'll explore our connection to the natural environment that surrounds us. Through the artwork of famous Canadian landscape artist Anne Meredith Barry and the myths and legends of Canada's Indigenous Peoples, students will respond to the artwork and stories by creating a correlating piece of art using multi-media and printmaking techniques.

**Curriculum connections:** Visual Arts, History, Social Studies, Language.
